- Disappointed that Sunberry, Blarney not included
- Some of the estates in Blarney were taken over but not the land needs to be addressed
- A detailed report on each estate requested for the next meeting
- Why some estates are not on the list
 - J. Molloy, SEO explained that Taking in Charge of an estate has to be requested by the landowner or by the residents.
- How are estates included if the Developer is in receivership
 - J. Molloy, SEO explained that they may have submitted a Taking in Charge application previously
- Are bonds still in place if not what is the situation
- (c) Resolution of Full Council

"That Cork County Council would establish a policy of retrofitting/improving vehicular parking in older estates, with the primary focus on disabled parking and access for emergency vehicles".

A discussion took place and it was agreed by all the Members that until such time as requested works have been carried out, they should not be facilitated.

J. Molloy, SEO explained that the NTA are the responsible body and should be contacted regarding any works to be carried out.
