J. Molloy, SEO outlined that there has been an application submitted under the Rural Generation Fund Scheme and he has also written to the Department of Culture, Heritage & the Gaeltacht on the matter. Once a breakdown of all costs has been completed he will submit this to the Department. It has been recommended that design works are carried out in order to proceed to Part 8 and that the Chief Executive and Minister Michael Creed have met on the issue.

A discussion took place among the Members where they welcomed the progress being made to date but stressed that the funding is urgently required.

In response to Cllr. Moynihan, J. Molloy, SEO said it is hoped to lodge Part 8 before Christmas.

C. O'Neill, S/MDO outlined that the works on Tower Playground should be commencing in the next few weeks. Cllr. Ryan welcomed this and queried if the lighting works would be carried out.

3 Year Non National Roads Programme

Dwyer, SEE said he would raise this with the Traffic Safety Officer and with the Gardai.
