DEPARTMENT OF TOURISM, CULTURE, ARTS, GAELTACHT, SPORT & MEDIA:

Correspondence dated 1st July 2021 in response to Council's letter dated 23rd June 2021 in relation to the supports for Local and Regional Newspapers

Members noted the correspondence from the Department of Tourism, Culture, Arts, Gaeltacht, Sport and Media.

CORK COUNTY COUNCIL TO ASK ETB TO CONSIDER EXPANDING RANGE OF EDUCATIONAL COURSES AVAILABLE AT MANNIX COLLEGE, CHARLEVILLE

Councillor Ian Doyle proposed, seconded by Councillor Gobnait Moynihan:

"That Cork County Council would ask ETB to consider expanding range of educational courses available at Mannix College, Charleville. Given the emphasis by government now on apprenticeships Mannix College is ideally placed to deliver courses for local requirements such as Engineering, Health Care, and Culinary and Hospitality skills."

During this discussion the Members made the following points:

- Members stated that Mallow College of Further Education was already providing courses for apprenticeships.
- Members stated apprenticeships are very important as currently there is a shortage of qualified tradespeople in the country which is impacting on the provision of housing.
- Suggested it was a National issue as 86% of construction companies needed suitability qualified staff
- Members noted that a good living could be made from trades /skills.
- Recommended that school leavers should be encouraged to consider a trade instead of College
- Stated that it is more complex than the ETB providing more courses. The attitude to trades /skills needs to change.
- Members said that in Germany 40% of school leavers go on to apprenticeships.
- Stated that there is a particular shortage of skills in "wet trades".
- Members suggested that by the ETB providing the courses locally, it will also help keep the people in the county towns.
- Councillor Patrick Gerard Murphy, Chairperson of the ETB stated that the ETB focus is to increase the capacity to deliver more courses outside the City. It' aim is to provide local hubs in rural town.
- The green and digital programmes recommended by European Committee will require specific skills that will need the correct training courses.
- The length of apprenticeships should be reviewed

Members agreed to write to the ETB and Minister of State at the Department of Further and Higher Education, Research, Innovation and Science to consider expanding the range of educational courses available at Mannix College, Charleville. Given the emphasis by government now on apprenticeships Mannix College is ideally placed to deliver courses for local requirements such as Engineering, Health Care, and Culinary and Hospitality skills.

 Members requested that the letter be forwarded to Kerry, Limerick and Tipperary local authorities because part of the counties fall within the catchment area of Mannix college, Charleveille.

PROVISION OF BI-LINGUAL PACKAGING ON GOODS IN IRELAND

Councillor Gobnait Moynihan proposed, seconded by Councillor Gillian Coughlan

"Call on the Minister for Enterprise, Trade and Employment, as well as the Minister for the Gaeltacht to carry out a feasibility study on the provision of bi-lingual packaging on goods in Ireland."

During this discussion the Members made the following points:

- Members suggested that all goods should be labelled in both Irish and English to promote Irish.
- Suggested that it should begin with a Feasibility Study.
- Members are not suggesting that extra costs be incurred by Businesses. Suggested that
 businesses avail of the Business Support Scheme provided by Foras na Gaeilge to assists with
 the extra costs.
- Stated that in school pupils learn by looking at an object and saying the word in Irish and that if people see Irish words regularly in every day packaging, they will learn some of the language.
- Stated that it is important that we use Irish language when we can to promote it.
- Suggested that practicing the language helps to improve the fluency.
- Stated that it ties in with the 'Guaranteed Irish Logo'.
- Members suggested that it also necessary to reduce the amount of packaging which will then reduce the amount of litter which will reduce pollution,
- Said 'Tír gan teanga, Tír gan anam' 'A country without it's language is a country without it's soul'
- Stated that people pick up terms without realising it when they are listening to the language.
