#### Welcome and Introduction.

**1. Confirmation of Minutes of the Previous LCDC Meeting of 12**<sup>th</sup> **December 2019.** The minutes of the South Cork LCDC meeting of 12th December, 2019 were adopted. They were proposed by Cllr. Marcia Dalton and seconded by Cllr. Seamas McGrath.

### Matters arising

There were no matters arising.

## 2. SICAP Case Study by SECAD – Presented by Donna Cleary (Goal 2 Officer) and Tara Doyle (Goal 1 Officer).

- This SICAP 2019 Case Study, "Celebrating Multiculturalism through Food", encapsulates both Goals 1 and 2 in relation to:
  - Providing (self) employment support to a New Community member in setting up a food business.
  - The use of 'Food' as a powerful cultural integrator amongst many New Communities in the SECAD area (especially Midleton, Carrigtwhohill & Macroom).
- Donna Cleary spoke about Izz Alkarajeh, a Palestinian former resident of a direct provision centre who now runs his own business in Cork City, Izz Cafe.
  - Izz availed of self employment supports under the SICAP programme including a six day start your business course and mentoring.
  - Izz wants to expand the business to employ more staff, produce sweet treats and ultimately create a franchise.
- Tara Doyle discussed Midleton fEAST, a collaboration between SECAD and the Midleton and Carrigtwohill family resource centres:
  - 15 18 countries are represented each year.
  - The event has grown significantly in popularity with our 250 attendees in 2019.
- Tara Doyle also discussed Macroom Food Flavours, a collaboration between SECAD, volunteers and business and community leaders:
  - An average of 17 countries are represented each year.
  - The event is popular with approximately 200 attendees in 2019.
- Spin off food events from Midleton fEAST and Macroom Food Flavours included:
  - o Celebrating multiculturism through food in cooperation with pre-schools.
  - "Making Health a Habit" a project which ran across Midleton, Macroom,
     Cobh and Youghal.



- Looking to the future, SECAD aim:
  - To plan and deliver multicultural food events at Macroom and Midleton food festivals.
  - To plan and facilitate cultural inclusion training using food to combat barriers and promote integration.
  - To continue to build on relationships with stakeholders and develop plans for rolling out further tailored actions.
- 300 "New Communities" children and families were engaged and supported through community integration projects involving food diversity and celebration through food festivals in 2019.

Cllr. Cathal Rasmussen noted that there are Syrian families in his Cobh constituency and that it is great to see these groups being integrated into the community.

Cllr. Marcia Dalton queried if HSE health and safety requirements provided challenges when undertaking these food based events. Ryan Howard said that as all of the food is given out free of charge at the events the HSE health and safety requirements are not as stringent. He confirmed that all HSE requirements are adhered to at these events.

Ryan Howard highlighted that the number of refugees coming to Cork is constantly increasing. He acknowledged the value of these types of events for integrating these individuals into their new communities and suggested that more be done in collaboration with the CETB to host more of them. He also stressed the importance of providing soft supports to refugees who want to start their own business.

### 3. Healthy Ireland

Ms. Kay Keegan highlighted that the South Cork Teen Talk event would be taking place in the Radisson Blu Hotel & Spa on March 31<sup>st</sup> 2020. The morning event would be for the transition year students who are registered to attend. The evening event, known as Gen Z, would be centred on parents and teachers.

### 4. Community Enhancement Programme, reallocation of funds.

The CEP fund for 2019 has closed, and there were some allocations which were never availed of, therefore leading to a balance on the fund. This was divided between the three Cork LCDCs and this allowed for a further allocation of €3,200 to the South Cork LCDC. The proposed allocations were as follows:
