1. ELECTION OF MAYOR

The outgoing Mayor called for nominations for the position of Mayor for the coming year.

Councillor Danny Collins was proposed by Councillor Declan Hurley, seconded by Councillor Seamus McGrath.

There was no requirement for a vote to be taken as no other candidate contested the election of the Mayor.

The outgoing Mayor declared Councillor Danny Collins elected as Mayor of the County Council.

Mayor Collins then took the Chair. He thanked Councillor Hurley and Councillor McGrath for proposing and seconding him for the role. Mayor Collins said he was raised in Lowertown, Schull and is inspired by his late mother who worked in many voluntary organisations. He said that his father had worked for Drinagh Co-op for many years and never missed work. He said he wants to meet as many voluntary groups as he can and understands groups are still trying to establish themselves after Covid19 pandemic. He said he looks forward to using his time in office to support as many people as he can.

The Mayor said County Cork is not getting its fair share of funding from local government. He said the All Ireland Research Observatory report shows discrepancy in funding for Cork and he wants to blow the dust off this report. The Mayor spoke about the centenary of the Civil War. He said it did untold harm to our country, divided many families, and took the lives of many people. He said Cork County Council will be delighted to take part in the programme of centenary commemoration events.

The Mayor thanked his partner, his family, friends and customers of the Boston Bar for all their support. He thanked the people of the Bantry Electoral Area for electing him to Cork County Council. He acknowledged the recent passing the former Member of Cork County Council, Noel Collins and remembered him as a gentleman.
