3. Presentation by Catherine Seale, Community Water Officer, Local Authority Waters Programme

Title: Update on the Local Authorities Water Programme

EU Water Framework Directive

- Achieve at least good water quality in all waters by 2027.
 - State agencies, local authorities and public bodies working together
 - o Involvement of water users and the public giving a voice to communities!
 - o River Basin Management Plans, in three cycles:
 - o 1st Cycle 2009-2015
 - o 2nd Cycle 2018-2021
 - o 3rd Cycle 2022-2027

The health of Ireland's streams, rivers, lakes, and estuaries.

- Nationally 53% of our surface waters are in Good or High ecological status.
- 47% are in an unsatisfactory ecological status

- Cork County better than most!
- However increasing nitrates & WQ in estuaries are a concern

Pressures on Water Quality in Cork County

- Hydromorphology 16%
- DWWWTS 5.9%
- Agriculture 28.2%
- Urban run-off 9.6%
- Urban wastewater 10.1%

Prioritised Areas for Action

- Local Catchment Assessment (LAWPRO)
- Implementing Bodies
- ASSAP

Community Water Development Fund

- The Department of Housing, Local Government, and Heritage funds LAWPRO to
 provide the Community Water Development Fund. This fund supports community
 groups to enhance the quality of local streams, rivers, lakes, and coastal areas. The
 fund has been in place since 2017, with growing interest year on year.
- The standard of applications for funding is high, making the assessment process more difficult. The fund delivers a broad range of water projects that benefit the amenity of local areas. Types of projects approved for funding include:
 - Awareness raising initiatives such as river clean ups, biodiversity information boards, citizen science workshops, outdoor classrooms, rainwater harvesting, and enhancement of wetlands.
 - Preparation of local plans such as feasibility studies, habitat management plans, ecological surveys, and biodiversity action plans.
 - River and habitat enhancement works such as planting of native species and hedgerow, pollinator friendly planting, river-bank stabilisation, fencing and riparian buffer zones.

Blue Dot Catchments Vision

Citizen Science Stream Index (CSSI)

Nature- based solutions to the management of rainwater

- New approach to surface water management
- Starting with Nature multiple benefits (water quality, biodiversity, climate)
- Making space for water and slowing the flow Green and blue infrastructure raingardens, swales, wetlands, green roofs,
- Integrate into planning and development of urban spaces

- Interim guidance document on best practice
- Communities can get involved e.g., Tidy Towns, Residents Associations, Sports Clubs

Phoebe Bright asked if micro hydro power as an energy source falls under LAWPRO's remit. Catherine Seale said that the area needs to be researched further but could potentially fall under LAWPRO's remit in the future. She recommended that any interested parties apply to LAWPRO for funding for a feasibility study.

Cllr. John O'Sullivan referred to a Teagasc water survey in Timoleague and asked that the results be made available to the EPA. Catherine Seale asked Cllr. John O'Sullivan to send a query to her and she will notify the EPA.

Ryan Howard congratulated Catherine Seale on the work and promoted an upcoming SECAD Partnership CLG river rewilding project.

Cllr. John O'Sullivan recommended that early consultation with effected parties regarding micro hydro power and River Catchment Plans should take place.

Catherine Seale thanked all the volunteers, groups and Local Development Companies who have offered their support to LAWPRO.
