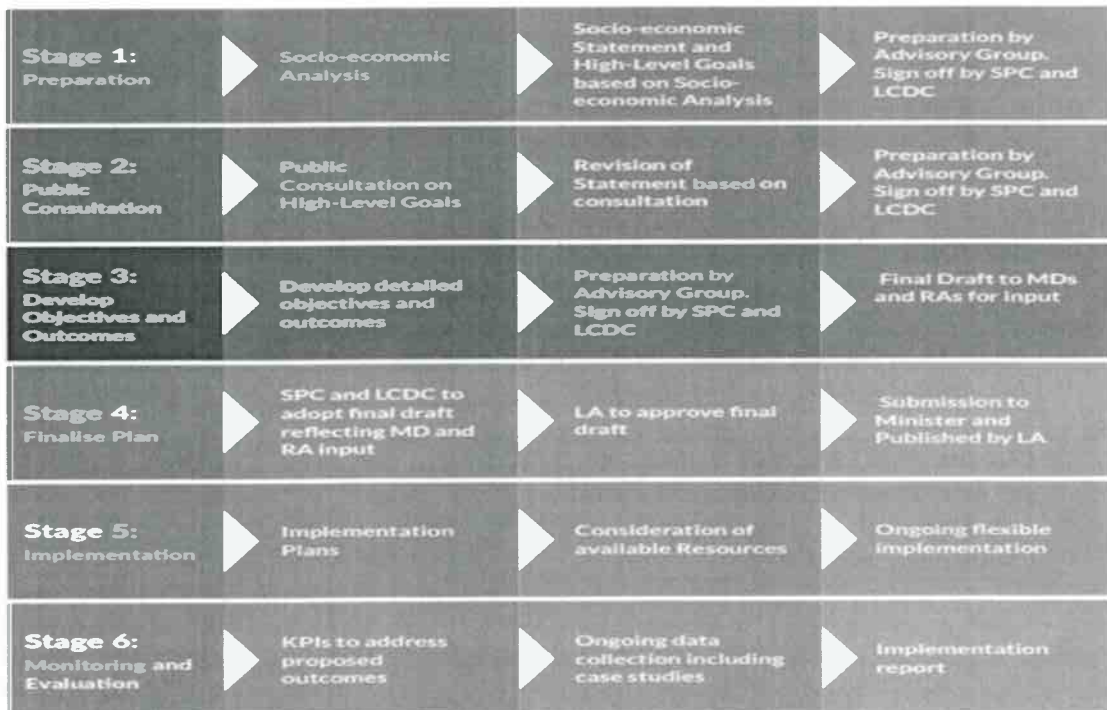

LECP Background

- ▶ Local Government Reform Act 2014
- ▶ Local element of the national framework
- ▶ 6-year strategic plan for Cork County which promotes and supports economic & local community development
- ▶ Led by the Local Authority, economic & community stakeholders
- ▶ Economic and societal changes since the 1st LECP
- ▶ Structures such as SPCs, LEOs, PPN, and LCDCs are now firmly established at local level
- ▶ New 2 stage process = LECP high level goals framework and Implementation Plan

LECP Stages



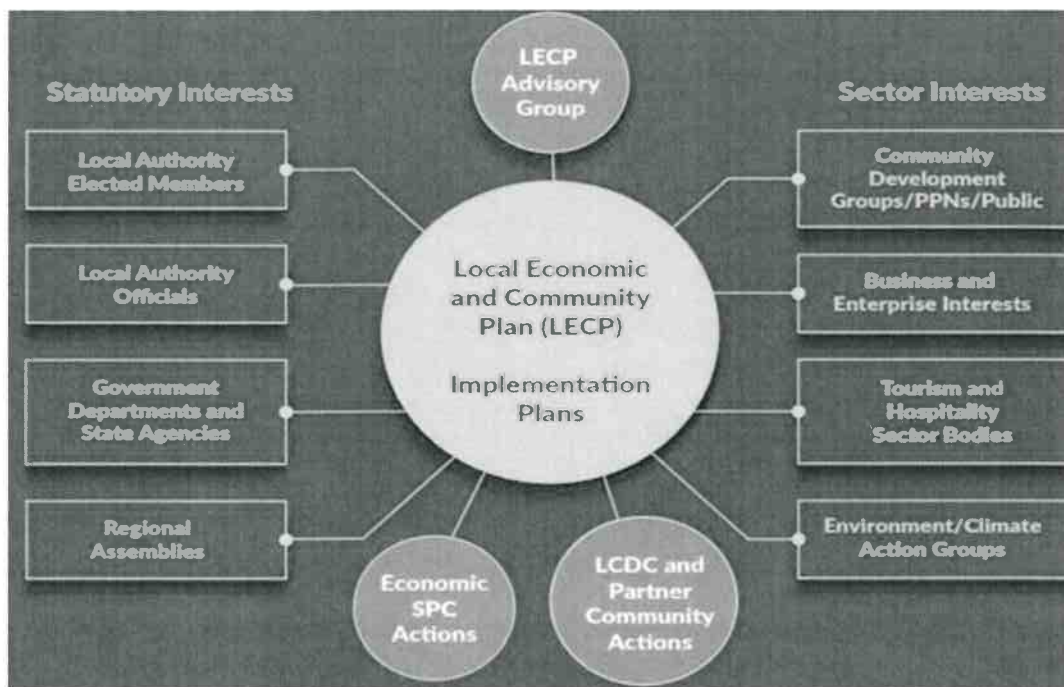
Structure and Purpose of the Advisory Steering Group

- ▶ One of the first steps is to establish an ASG to assist in and advise on the preparation, adoption, implementation and monitoring of the LECP
- ▶ To ensure an integrated plan – bringing community and economic elements together
- ▶ Advisory Steering Group to include:
 - LCDC members
 - SPC members
 - Chief Officer – LCDC
 - Director of Service EDET
 - Senior stakeholders – public & private bodies

LCDC – Lead Role

- ▶ LECP has 2 separate but interconnected elements – economic and community development
- ▶ The Local Government Reform Act 2014 requires the community elements are developed through the LCDCS
- ▶ Multiple policies to be taken on board for example Our Rural Future, Making Remote Work, Roadmap for Social Inclusion
- ▶ Regional elements through the Regional Spatial and Economic Strategies and Regional Enterprise Plans

Employment

HLG 1: Provide for a wide range of employment opportunities, across the county, which enable all citizens to participate fully in society and the economy

HLG 2: Provide for a physical economic network consisting of land, premises, facilities and supporting infrastructure

HLG 3: Provide for a business environment and entrepreneurship that facilitates creation, innovation and growth within the sector

HLG 4: Promote Cork as Ireland's Second City Region and facilitate population growth above the natural growth rate, increasing the local economic market and workforce

HLG 1: Drive growth through research and innovation, across social and economic sectors and throughout the county
