We have completed the review of the Pre-Connection Enquiry.

Irish Water has reviewed the pre-connection enquiry in relation to a Water & Wastewater connection for a Housing Development of 26 unit(s) at Ballinamona, Fermoy, Co. Cork (the Development).

Based upon the details provided we can advise the following regarding connecting to the networks;

Water
 Connection

Feasible without infrastructure upgrade by Irish Water:

In order to facilitate the proposed Development connection, local operational changes are required to the existing water network. These operational changes will be confirmed as part of the connection agreement process.

 Wastewater - Connection Feasible without infrastructure upgrade by Irish Water:

It is proposed to provide a new wastewater pumping station to serve the existing Crann Ard Estate, in addition to the proposed development. The existing Crann Ard network, pumping station and rising main has not been taken in charge by Irish Water, therefore it will be necessary to get permission from the owner to undertake any upgrade/diversion works within the existing estate, in addition to obtaining permission for Irish Water to take in charge the arterial route from the proposed development to the Irish Water infrastructure on Pike Road. Any infrastructure taken in charge will need to be inspected by Irish Water's field engineers to ensure that it has capacity and is in a good condition. Any subsequent upgrade requirements for the existing network identified at this stage will have to be funded by you the developer.

While there is currently capacity in the Fermoy wastewater treatment plant to facilitate the proposed connection, this capacity

is limited and there are a large number of developments in the Fermoy area. Should enough of these developments progress before you make a connection application, this capacity may be utilised by others. In this case it will be necessary for you to enter into an agreement with Irish Water, wherein you, the developer, will fund upgrades to the wastewater treatment plant to be carried out by Irish Water.

This letter does not constitute an offer, in whole or in part, to provide a connection to any Irish Water infrastructure. Before the Development can be connected to our network(s) you must submit a connection application and be granted and sign a connection agreement with Irish Water.

As the network capacity changes constantly, this review is only valid at the time of its completion. As soon as planning permission has been granted for the Development, a completed connection application should be submitted. 


