GLOSSARY OF TERMS



APPENDIX 1: GLOSSARY OF TERMS

A

Appropriate Assessment: (AA) an assessment of the potential adverse effects of a plan or project (in combination with other plans or projects) on Special Areas of Conservation and Special Protection Areas. These sites are protected by National and European Law.

B

“Bottom-up” approach: This emphasises the participation of the local community in development initiatives so that they can select their own goals and the means of achieving them. It also ensures community ownership, commitment and accountability to the development project as it seeks development from below.

C

Circular Economy: A model of production and consumption, which involves sharing, leasing, reusing, repairing, refurbishing and recycling existing materials and products as long as possible, thus extending the life cycle of products.

Climate change: Includes both the global warming driven by human emissions of greenhouse gases, and the resulting large-scale shifts in weather patterns.

Climate Neutral Economy: An economy with net zero greenhouse gas emissions.

E

Ecosystem: A community or group of living organisms that live in and interact with each other in a specific environment.

Evaluation: The structured interpretation and giving of meaning to predicted or actual impacts of proposals or results. It looks at original objectives, and at what is either predicted or what was accomplished and how it was accomplished.

F

Framework plan: A document that provides a methodology for directing change in the community over time. This type of plan is to be differentiated from a traditional comprehensive plan that attempts to address in depth and in detail all of the elements required to govern the long-range growth of the area. While providing a powerful long-term vision, it does not attempt to define each and every policy and detail necessary to achieve that vision.



I

Implementation Plan: A document that entails the steps required to facilitate the execution and implementation of a plan, idea, model, or policy by presenting clear implementation steps that need to follow.

Indicator: A measurable and quantitative statistic which, when grouped over a time period, shows a trend.

L

Labour Force: Those at work, looking for first regular job and unemployed.

LEADER Programme: A European Union initiative to support rural development projects initiated at the local level in order to revitalise rural areas and create jobs.

Low Carbon Economy: An economy that causes low levels of (Greenhouse Gas) GHG emissions compared with today's carbon-intensive economy.

M

Mitigation: An action that helps to lessen the impacts of a process or development on the receiving environment (most often in association with measures that would seek to reduce negative impacts of a process or development).

Monitoring: The systematic process of collecting, analysing and using information to track a programme's progress toward reaching its objectives and to guide management decisions. Successful monitoring delivers timely and relevant information that allows you to track progress towards outcomes and make adjustments to implementation arrangements as necessary.

P

Public Consultation: a regulatory process by which the public's input on matters affecting them is sought. Its main goals are in improving the efficiency, transparency and public involvement in large-scale projects or laws and policies. It usually involves notification (to publicise the matter to be consulted on), consultation (a two-way flow of information and opinion exchange) as well as participation (involving interest groups in the drafting of policy or legislation).

Public Realm: The external places in our towns and cities that are accessible to all. The everyday spaces that we move through and linger within, the places where we live, work and play.

R

Reserved Function: A reserved function of a Local Authority is one which can only be performed by the elected members.

Review: A part of the planning process to assess the progress of implementation. They are a 'snapshot' in the life of an initiative and tend to focus on operational issues, effectiveness of governance and project management structures, and may also include policy outcomes. Findings and recommendations from reviews should be used to improve implementation.



S

Smarter Travel: Short for the Department of Transport's Sustainable Transport policy document 'Smarter Travel, A Sustainable Transport Future 2009 –2020'.

Social entrepreneurship: An approach by individuals, groups, start-up companies or entrepreneurs, in which they develop, fund and implement solutions to social, cultural, or environmental issues. This concept may be applied to a wide range of organisations, which vary in size, aims, and beliefs.

Socio-economic Analysis: A tool to evaluate what costs and benefits an action will create for society by comparing what will happen if this action is implemented as compared to the situation where the action is not implemented.

Social Enterprise: An enterprise that trades for a social/societal purpose, where at least part of its income is earned from its trading activity, is separate from government, and where the surplus is primarily reinvested in the social objective.

Social Inclusion: The process of improving the terms on which individuals and groups take part in society—improving the ability, opportunity, and dignity of those disadvantaged on the basis of their identity.

Social Infrastructure: A subset of the infrastructure sector and typically includes assets that accommodate social services. Examples include schools, universities, hospitals, prisons and community housing.

Spatial Planning: Planning that gives geographical expression to the economic, social, cultural and ecological policies of society. It is at the same time a scientific discipline, an administrative technique and a policy developed as an interdisciplinary and comprehensive approach directed towards balanced regional development and the physical organisation of space according to an overall strategy.

Stakeholder: a person such as an employee, customer, or citizen who is involved with an organisation, society, etc. and therefore has responsibilities towards it and an interest in its success.

Strategic Environmental Assessment: A systematic decision support process, aiming to ensure that environmental and possibly other sustainability aspects are considered effectively in policy, plan and program making.

Sustainable Development: Development that meets the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs.

APPENDIX 2: AA/SEA SCREENING DETERMINATIONS

Screening for Appropriate Assessment (AA) Determination for the Cork County Local Economic and Community Plan 2024-2030

This determination whether the Cork County Local Economic and Community Plan 2024-2030 to be adopted would or would not necessitate the undertaking of Stage 2 Appropriate Assessment (AA) under Council Directive 92/43/EEC on the Conservation of Natural Habitats and of Wild Fauna and Flora (as amended) and the European Communities (Birds and Natural Habitats) Regulations 2011 (as amended).

An accompanying Screening for AA Report has been prepared to inform this determination. As identified in that report:

- Implementing the Plan will involve Cork County Council helping to facilitate, promote, support and coordinate stakeholders in their activities in a way that is consistent with existing and emerging plans setting out public policy for sustainable development, including that relating to the economy, communities, infrastructure, land use tourism and environmental protection and environmental management. The Plan is situated alongside this hierarchy of statutory documents that has been subject to environmental assessment/screening for environmental assessment, as appropriate, and forms the decision-making and consent-granting framework. The Plan does not provide consent or establish a framework for granting consent and will not be binding on any decisions relating to the granting of consent.
- The Plan fully aligns with the provisions of the existing National Planning Framework, Ireland 2040, National Climate Action Plan 2023, Housing For All 2021, the Regional Spatial and Economic Strategy and the Cork County Development Plan 2022-2028, all of which have been subject to legislative requirements relating to public consultation and environmental assessment/screening for environmental assessment. As such, the Plan is wholly subject to the requirements of the provisions set out in these documents, including provisions relating to sustainable development, environmental protection and environmental management that have been integrated into these documents, including through SEA and AA processes, and does not introduce any alterations or additions to those provisions.
- In order to be realised, projects included in the Plan (in a similar way to other projects from any other sectors) will have to comply, as relevant, with various legislation, policies, plans and programmes (including requirements for lower-tier Appropriate Assessment, Environmental Impact Assessment and other licencing requirements as appropriate) that form the statutory decision-making and consent-granting framework.
- Following the source-pathway-receptor model, the relevant attributes of European sites were assessed. The Plan does not introduce any additional sources for effects that were not already considered by the existing planning framework and associated AA processes.



- The risks to the safeguarding and integrity of the qualifying interests, special conservation interests and conservation objectives of the European sites have been addressed through the existing planning framework (which has been subject to Appropriate Assessment processes) with which the Plan and all lower tier plans/projects must comply. In addition, any future projects, plans etc. that may arise will themselves be subject to AA/screening for AA when further details of design and location are known.
- It is concluded that the Plan to be adopted is not likely to result in significant effects on European sites and will not give rise to any effects on the ecological integrity of any European Site, alone or in combination with any other plans, programmes, and projects etc. Consequently, Stage Two AA (including the preparation of a Natura Impact Statement) is advised as not being required.

The undersigned, having carefully considered the information referred to above agrees with and adopts the reasoning and conclusion presented above and in the “Screening for Appropriate Assessment Report”. The undersigned hereby determines that the Cork County Local Economic and Community Plan 2024-2030 to be adopted is not likely to result in significant effects on European sites and will not give rise to any effects on the ecological integrity of any European Site, alone or in combination with any other plans, programmes, and projects etc. Consequently, Stage Two AA (including the preparation of a Natura Impact Statement) is not required.

Screening for Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA) Determination for the Cork County Local Economic and Community Plan 2024-2030

This determination relates to whether the Cork County Local Economic and Community Plan 2024-2030 to be adopted, would or would not, be likely to have significant environmental effects, taking into account relevant criteria set out under the SEA Directive (Directive 2001/42/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council of Ministers, of 27th June 2001, on the Assessment of the Effects of Certain Plans and Programmes on the Environment); and therefore would, or would not, necessitate the undertaking of Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA).

The criteria set out under Annex II of the SEA Directive 'Criteria for determining the likely significance of effects referred to in Article 3(5)' are considered in an accompanying Screening for SEA Report that has been prepared to inform this determination.

As identified in the SEA Screening Report:

- Implementing the Plan will involve Cork County Council helping to facilitate, promote, support and coordinate stakeholders in their activities in a way that is consistent with existing and emerging plans setting out public policy for sustainable development, including that relating to the economy, communities, infrastructure, land use tourism and environmental protection and environmental management. The Plan is situated alongside this hierarchy of statutory documents that has been subject to environmental assessment/screening for environmental assessment, as appropriate, and forms the decision-making and consent-granting framework. The Plan does not provide consent or establish a framework for granting consent and will not be binding on any decisions relating to the granting of consent.
- The Plan fully aligns with the provisions of the existing National Planning Framework, Ireland 2040, National Climate Action Plan 2023, Housing For All 2021, the Regional Spatial and Economic Strategy and the Cork County Development Plan 2022-2028, all of which have been subject to legislative requirements relating to public consultation and environmental assessment/screening for environmental assessment. As such, the Plan is wholly subject to the requirements of the provisions set out in these documents, including provisions relating to sustainable development, environmental protection and environmental management that have been integrated into these documents, including through SEA and AA processes, and does not introduce any alterations or additions to those provisions.
- In order to be realised, projects included in the Plan (in a similar way to other projects from any other sectors) will have to comply, as relevant, with various legislation, policies, plans and programmes (including requirements for lower-tier Appropriate Assessment, Environmental Impact Assessment and other licencing requirements as appropriate) that form the statutory decision-making and consent-granting framework. It is a specific provision of the Plan to ensure that all of the provisions from the County Development Plan identified in the accompanying Screening for SEA and AA reports shall be complied with throughout the implementation of the Plan.



- Taking into account the above, it is demonstrated that: significant beneficial environmental effects are present already under the existing planning framework and would not result from the Plan; and potentially significant adverse effects, if unmitigated, are present already under the existing planning framework, have already been envisaged and mitigated by the relevant assessments and would not result from the Plan. Consequently, it is advised that the Plan would not result in likely significant environmental effects and does not necessitate the undertaking of SEA.

The undersigned, having carefully considered the information referred to above agrees with and adopts the reasoning and conclusion presented above and in the “Screening for Strategic Environmental Assessment Report”. The undersigned hereby determines that SEA is not required for the Cork County Local Economic and Community Plan 2024-2030 to be adopted.

Statement on the Cork County Council Draft Framework Plan Local Economic and Community Plan (LECP) 2023 - 2029

The Regional Assemblies' role in the LECP process is set out under Section 44 of the Local Government Reform Act 2014 (amending Section 66C of the Local Government Act 2001), in particular section 66C 2(c) and 3(c), which states that the consideration of an LECP by the Regional Assembly shall relate to its consistency with (i) the core strategy and the objectives of the development plan of the local authority concerned, (ii) any Regional Spatial and Economic Strategy (RSES) or, as appropriate, Regional Planning Guidelines (RPGs) that may apply, and (iii) between the economic and community elements of the Plan.

The Cork County LECP was considered by the members of the Regional Assembly at their meeting of 12th January 2024 where it was agreed:

1. To commend the work of Cork County Council and LCDC in the development of the LECP and
2. In accordance with Section 44 of Local Government Reform Act 2014 (amending Section 66C of the Local Government Act 2001), the Regional Assembly are satisfied that the Cork County Council Draft Framework Plan Local Economic and Community Plan 2023-2029 has demonstrated consistency with:-
 - (i) the core strategy and the objectives of the Development Plan,
 - (ii) The Regional Spatial and Economic Strategy for the Southern Region, and
 - (iii) between the community and economic elements of the LECP.

Subject to the recommendations as follows:

- In the Socio-Economic Profile of Cork County section:
 - Include the Monard SDZ Metropolitan Town on diagrams within the section, this is a designation in the County Development Plan.
 - Include the MASP boundary on the Urban/Rural Classification Diagram and the Labour Force 2022 diagram.

- o Include the Strategic Employment Locations of: Carrigtwohill, Little Island, Ringaskiddy and Whitegate on the Labour Force 2022 diagram.
- HLG 1 should be strengthened by:
 - o referencing in the Policy Section that it is an ambition of the RSES to be one of the Europe's most Creative and Innovative, Greenest and Liveable Regions,
 - o include support for the growth of the Metropolitan Area, designated Key Towns and settlements in accordance with the RSES and County Development Plan in the Objectives Section, and
 - o reference support for the implementation of CMATS under the Actions section for the Objective to, "*Support and promote initiatives and projects which improve access to public transport for rural and urban areas, including enhanced connectivity and public transport offering.*", in the Draft Initial Implementation Plan.
 - The Assembly Members recommended that the LECP should include further objectives to support better public transport connections, particularly to Carrigaline the largest town in the County.
- The reference to the Learning Region under HLG 2 should be strengthened by referencing support for the development of the Southern Region as a UNESCO Learning Region, in which Co. Cork can participate to develop opportunities for life-long learning and skills development.
- The Regional Skills Fora referenced under HLG 6 can also play a role in supporting skills development and should be referenced under HLG 2 also.
- HLG 5 should be strengthened by referencing support for enterprise proposals in the MASP and at the four Strategic Employment Locations.
