1. Confirmation of Minutes of Meeting held on 01st March 2024

The Minutes of the Monthly Meeting held on 01st March 2024 were unanimously adopted on the **proposal of Clir T O' Shea and seconded by Clir P Hayes.**

Matter Arising from Minutes.

No matters arose.

2. <u>Presentations</u>

(a) Healthy Age Friendly Homes. Presentation of programme and introduction of new coordinators. *Appendix 1

This presentation was given by Mr Anthony Holmes Regional Programme Manager-South West& Ms Norah Crowley, HAFH Local Coordinator Cork.
All members welcomed this initiative and the information provided.

(b) Report on Mallow Swimming Pool.

This presentation was given by Ms Claire Barr, Municipal District Officer on behalf of Mr Eoin O' Mahony, Manager Mallow Swimming Pool. *Appendix 2 Members welcomed the report and made the following comments:

Cllr P Hayes said that there should be more of a connection between Mallow Swimming Pool and Cork County Council.

Cllr Gearoid Murphy welcomed the report and asked if this could be provided on a quarterly basis. He also asked of the possibility of more public hours being made available and the re-introduction of private one to one lessons. He also asked about the planned upgrade of the pool.

Cllr E Kenny welcomed the introduction of Autistic Friendly hours and asked about the possibility of engaging with Mallow Chamber of Commerce in this respect as Mallow is an Autism Friendly Town.

Cllr L Madden highlighted the issue of lack of parking in the complex and asked about the possibility of the land in front of the Swimming Pool being acquired. He said that this could cause an issue for emergency services gaining access. Cllr T O Shea also asked about the re-introduction of private one to one lessons.

The MDO and SEO responded as follows:

With regard to the upgrade the tenders are currently being assessed and will then go to Senior Management for funding options.

Allocation of public hours will be discussed with Pool Management.

There will be no re-instatement of private one to one lessons.

Mallow Chamber will be engaged with in relation to the Autism Friendly initiative.

The Presentation will be circulated to members.

(c) Presentation on Kanturk TCF (Town Centre First) Funding for TCF Plan.

This presentation was given by Ms Noelle Desmond, Town Regeneration Officer *Appendix 3

Members welcomed this update and all queries were dealt with by the TRO.

3. Section 183 - Disposal Notice

4. Notices of Motion.

- (a) Cllr B Moynihan (20/03/2024) "That a comprehensive update be provided On progress on dealing with derelict properties On the top of strand street Kanturk and the Centre of the village Boherbue."
- (b) Clir B Moynihan (20/03/2024) "That an update be provided on timelines for Upgraded waste water treatment system In Ballydesmond."
- (c) Cllr B Moynihan (20/03/2024) "That an update be provided on the resurfacing of the road between the train station and the Community centre in Banteer."

As Cllr Moynihan was off-line at this time it was agreed to defer these motions to later in the meeting.

(d) Cllr I Doyle (29/03/2024) "That Cork County Council would give update on traffic calming measures for Turrets Charleville." Proposed by: Cllr I Doyle, Seconded by: Cllr JP O' Shea Response by: Mr Billy O' Sullivan, Senior Executive Engineer

Please note that NTA funding has been sought for these works. An initial design has been completed which entails extending the existing footpath by 30m and the installation of a pedestrian crossing. A Safety Audit is now to be undertaken and any recommendations arising from same will be incorporated into the design. Once complete, a Section 38 Application will be advanced. It is envisaged that the works will be completed during 2024 subject to availability of funding.

(2) Cllr I Doyle (29/03/2024) "That Cork County Council would give update on traffic calming measures on Western side of Newtown Village."

Proposed by: Cllr I Doyle, Seconded by: Cllr JP O' Shea Response by: Mr Billy O' Sullivan, Senior Executive Engineer

Drawings of proposed Section 38 for Newtown Village was distributed to members.

NTA funding has been sought for the design of traffic calming measures in Newtownshandrum Village. Section 38 Planning was published for the proposed works. Observations and comments received as part of the planning process have been reviewed and the proposed works have now been redesigned to incorporate same where applicable. The final design is being presented to Members at this meeting.

(f) Clir I Doyle (29/03/2024) "That Cork County Council would look at surface water drainage on Broghil Road Charleville."

Proposed by: Cllr I Doyle, Seconded by: Cllr JP O Shea Response by: Mr Billy O' Sullivan, Senior Executive Engineer

The Area Engineer will inspect the area concerned to determine the extents of the works required.

(g) Clir L Madden (01/04/2024) "Maintenance Programme for Playgrounds with particular influence on Buttevant what is schedule for here."

Proposed by: Cllr L Madden, Seconded by: Cllr T O' Shea Response by: Ms Claire Barr, Municipal District Officer

The 2024 playground budget for Kanturk Mallow Municipal District is €26,981. Unfortunately a budget of this size only provides us with a budget for reactive costs and would not provide the scope for a playgrounds maintenance programme for our 47 playgrounds, mugas and outdoor gyms. I am aware Buttevant Playground requires a new soft surface and have sought costing's for same. Once I have the quotes I will seek additional funding to carry out the works.

This motion was also supported by ClIr E Kenny who asked if there are any plans to re-open the playground at Woodview Drive in Mallow The Municipal District Officer responded to say that there is no budget available at present to re-instate the damaged and removed equipment and also advised members that the damage at this playground had not been the first incident. ClIr L Madden commented to say that the budget available for playgrounds is very small to cover the 47 playgrounds across the district and asked if perhaps funding could be made available from the Town Development Fund.

(h) "Second drainage crew which were to be assigned to road Programme
Update and urgent need for same."

Proposed by: Cllr L Madden, Seconded by: Cllr T O' Shea Response by: Mr Billy O' Sullivan, Senior Executive Engineer

Two Drainage Crews have been operational in the various areas in the Kanturk/Mallow MD for Quarter 1 of 2024. With the recent commencement of Restoration Improvement and Restoration Maintenance Works, it may not be possible to maintain two crews in operation at all times as crews will be required to undertake advance preparation/drainage works and provide assistance for the Restoration Improvement and Restoration Maintenance Works for 2024. On completion of works or breaks in planned works and as resources allow, the two Drainage Crews will be in place.

(i) Cllr L Madden (01/04/2024) "Update on traffic coming from Roundabout and change of right of way onto park road which was part of Dairygold planning and the need for same to alleviate traffic off main street."

Proposed by: Cllr L Madden, Seconded by: Cllr Gearoid Murphy Response by: Mr Billy O' Sullivan, Senior Executive Engineer

Planning Application Ref. No.20/4925 refers and Condition No.38 attached to the grant of permission states 'all works to the N72 as shown in the application shall be completed by the applicant, at their own expense, prior to the opening of any additional units within the site'

The Developer has been engaging with Cork County Council regarding Planning Condition Compliance on the site and in the most recent correspondence Cork County Council have sought clarification on the programming of the N72 Works to ensure compliance with the condition.

(j) Cllr Gearoid Murphy (02/04/2024) "To seek an update on the €4.7 million in URDF funding which was provided for Mallow, and in particular how much of this has been spent and how much is remaining."

Proposed by: Cllr Gearoid Murphy, Seconded by: Cllr P Hayes Response by: Ms Claire Barr, Municipal District Officer

The Mallow URDF Grant allocation of €4.7m was allocated across 1 main project and 3 smaller sub projects. The update on each element of the project and spending to date is as follows:

Main Street Public Realm(funding allocation €3.9m); Decision Gate 1 of the public spending code to proceed to design was approved by the Dept. Documents are now with the Dept for Decision Gate 2 which is approval to go to tender. We are currently updating the Business Case and Project Costs at the request of the Dept. When these are submitted we hope to have decision Gate 2 approved by the Dept to allow us to proceed to tender. Funding will only be drawn down once a tender is awarded and a contract proceeds on site. Subject to Dept approval we hope to go to tender in Q3 2024. Mallow Castle Visitor Destination Development (funding allocation €367,500); Funding of €85,000 has been spent to date on this project to investigate the potential for development of a visitor destination experience in the Granary. The business case for the potential project could not be justified with respect to the likely costs of the project and therefore Cork County Council have requested approval from URDF to spend the balance of the funding under this heading to carry out conservation works to the Granary buildings, we are currently awaiting final approval to proceed.

Pilot Vacant Property Scheme (funding allocation €450,000); Cork Co Co have requested approval from the Dept to purchase a vacant, derelict property under this scheme. We are currently engaging with owners of a suitable property re purchase. The dept have requested condition surveys, cost plan and business case for the purchase before approval will be given to spend the funding allocation. We expect to have these submitted to the Dept in April.

The Senior Executive Officer further responded to say that a "Use it or Loose it" principle does not apply to this funding rather he said a business case is put forward for approval to spend. He advised that there is consistent engagement with the Department by Finbarr Jones, Executive Engineer and his team where he said that Stage 1 would be Tender of Design with approval to move to Stage 2.

Cllr Gearoid Murphy asked if a written response to this motion could be provided to members.

(k) Cllr Gearoid Murphy (02/04/2024) "To seek an update on plans for a pedestrian crossing and other safety measures outside the entrance to River Valley estate in Mallow."

Proposed by: Cllr Gearoid Murphy, Seconded by: Cllr P Hayes Response by: Mr Billy O' Sullivan, Senior Executive Engineer

A Pedestrian crossing and associated traffic calming measures have been identified for this location and an application for NTA Funding has been submitted by the Mallow Area Office for 2024. The allocation of funding remains unconfirmed to date.

Notwithstanding the above, following a site meeting between Mallow Area Office and the Non-National Road Design Office, it's proposed to advance the design for a pedestrian crossing and associated traffic calming measures at this location to Section 38 in Qtr.2 of 2024 to ensure the project is ready to proceed should a funding stream be approved in 2024.

Cllr Gearoid Murphy expressed his dis-appointment that there had been no progress here to date. He said that this road is posing a danger to both drivers and pedestrians

The motion was supported by Cllr's L Madden and E Kenny also.

(I) Clir T O' Shea (03/04/2024) "That Cork Co Council would update Members on the service sites in Ard an Chaisleàin Liscaroll."

Proposed by: Clir T O' Shea, Seconded by: Clir Gearoid Murphy Response by: Ms Claire Barr, Municipal District Officer

Serviced sites at Ard an Chaisleain, Liscarroll are in the ownership of Respond AHB. Discussions are being held with the AHB around their future potential use

Cllr T O' Shea expressed his dis-appointment with this response and asked if the Municipal District could write to the Housing Directorate to ask what plans are in place

(m) Cllr T O' Shea (03/04/2024) "That Cork Co Council would look at some kind of traffic Calming measures in Cecilstown Village."

Proposed by: Clir T O' Shea, Seconded by: Clir P Hayes Response by: Mr Billy O' Sullivan, Senior Executive Engineer

The design for a Traffic Calming Scheme in Cecilstown Village is being progressed via the Non-National Road Design Office. It's expected to seek Section 38 approval in 2024. It is noted that there is no funding stream available at present for the scheme.

Cllr T O' Shea asked if the results of the speed survey could be shared with members.

(n) Cllr T O' Shea (03/04/2024) "That Cork Co Council would give an update on the proposed pedestrian crossing outside Centra in Buttevant."

Proposed by: Cllr T O' Shea, Seconded by: Cllr L Madden Response by: Mr Billy O' Sullivan, Senior Executive Engineer

As this relates to a National Primary Road, it was referred to the Cork RDO Office who have since advised that this item has been raised with TII and it is under consideration. However, it is noted that a new pedestrian crossing at Buttevant is not currently funded by TII.

Cllr T O' Shea proposed this and said that this follow's on from numerous calls.

Cllr L Madden seconding the motion said that Cork County Council Roads Design Office have been involved here in excess of 2 years with no progress. Cllr Gearoid Murphy supported this motion also and members asked the Senior Executive Engineer if TII can be contacted for a further response here.

(o) Cllr E Kenny (03/04/2024) "That Cork County Council will give exact and detailed information on where the €1 million grant, given by the European Regional Development fund in 2016, to create an Arts and Culture Hub for Mallow, has gone, a definitive timeframe on the redevelopment of Mallow Town Hall, detailed information on previous and expected planning and tender since 2016 and into the future and if

council officials are willing to attend a 'Town Hall' meeting on the redevelopment, for the purpose of providing detailed information to the community."

Proposed by: Cllr E Kenny, Seconded by: Cllr Gearoid Murphy Response by: Ms Claire Barr, Municipal District Officer

An ERDF grant in the amount of €1m was awarded to a previous project to renovate the Town Hall into and Arts and Culture Hub for Mallow in 2016. This project however did not subsequently proceed as planned in 2016. The ERDF Grant was reallocated to the Mallow Boardwalk project with the agreement of the funding partners and this decision was advised to the elected members. The original project (which had Part 8 approval in 2015) did not proceed following a review of the business case and the proposed scale of works which were deemed to be insufficient.

Cork County Council Architects then reviewed the project, including the proposed use of the building and the scale of works required to deliver a modern, fit for purpose and energy efficient building. This led to a new Part 8 for the current project being proposed and passed by Council in 2021. The current status of the project is that much of the detailed design required in order to tender the project has been completed and a business case for the project has been produced. Cork County Council are updating stakeholders and potential users of the building at briefings on April 16th and April 17th in mallow Library in order to get feedback before finalising tender and construction documents. Finally Cork County Council are currently sourcing funding for the project to allow us to proceed to the next stage.

Cllr E Kenny proposing the motion asked who made the decision to re-allocate the €1m funding towards the Boardwalk project. He asked what progress has been made here since 2016. He welcomed the stakeholder meeting that is being convened however he said that the general public are unaware of this project and he asked if a Town Hall meeting could be called where the public could attend.

Cllr Gearoid Murphy seconded the motion and said that there was no planning for this project when announced in 2016, however he said that the planning process has now completed and public consultation has taken place. He expressed the opinion that Thrive funding looks like the most attractive option at present.

The motion was supported by Cllr P Hayes and Cllr L Madden who clarified that all information was shared with constituents at the time.

The Senior Executive Officer further responded to say that initial engagement will be with potential users of the building, however he agreed that an update the public is important also. He also confirmed that it was Cork County Council's decision to re-allocate the funding.

(p) Cllr E Kenny (03/04/2024) "That Cork County Council will hold a Civic Reception for Centre Stage School Mallow, for serving the community for 20 years and give a written citation complementing the work, commitment and dedication given to the many present and past students of Mallow and its hinterlands."

Proposed by: Cllr E Kenny, Seconded by: Cllr Gearoid Murphy

Response by: Ms Claire Barr, Municipal District Officer

Corporate policy in relation to Municipal District receptions is that 2 such receptions are permitted per year. Currently members have requested and approved 2 such receptions this year already and therefore we are unable to facilitate a 3rd Municipal District reception in this Council year. Members may wish to consider combining this proposed reception with one of the already agreed receptions or deferring the matter until the new Municipal District meets after the Local Elections.

The Senior Executive Officer clarified that this is a Municipal District Reception and not a Civic Reception as stated on the motion.

It was agreed that Centre Stage and DBM First Responders would be hosted together and Thomas Davis Pipe Band would be hosted on another date.

(q) Cllr E Kenny (03/04/2024) "That Cork County Council will look at the possibility of creating a zoned parking system in Bowling Green Car Park Mallow. A zoned system could facilitate all day, three hour and one hour parking, which would help all businesses and shop owners in the area, while also giving people the opportunity of all day parking. The best way of doing this would implement a coloured zoned system. At present, the many businesses in the Bowling Green area are struggling to find spaces for customers, due to the all-day parking system. Also, that Cork County Council will clearly paint and line parking spaces outside the shop units opposite the funeral home."

Proposed by: Cllr E Kenny, Seconded by: Cllr Gearoid Murphy Response by: Ms Claire Barr, Municipal District Officer

The operation of the Bowling Green Car Par and other public carparks in Mallow Town Centre is included for review as part of the Mallow Public Realm URDF project. Consultants for that project will be asked to consider this proposal as part of that review including the practicality and costs of implementing such as system. A zoned system would also require redrafting of the Mallow parking byelaws if it were to be considered. The spaces to the front of the shop units will be re-done.

As Cllr B Moynihan was not available it was agreed to defer his motions to another meeting.

4. Consideration of Reports and Recommendations.

4.1 Municipal District Officers Report presented by Ms Claire Barr MDO as follows.

Members were presented with the Municipal District Officers Report prior to the meeting. Members were requested to approve the following:

Clir E Kenny asked to clarify if this allocation of grant funding is also giving approval for the mural to proceed

Clir Gearoid Murphy asked if approval would be required from the ESB and also said that final design should also be approved

The Municipal District Officer responded that she would link in with this group in these respects.

Clir JP O' Shea welcomed the new technology at the gates which permits access being made available to Mallow Castle Carpark by by Mallow Castle Parkrun. He queried a date for the official handing over of the keys to the old fire station in Kanturk to Kanturk Mens Shed group.

The Municipal District Officer stated she would contact all members to invite to official hand over of keys in next few weeks.

Clir I Doyle raised the issue of overgrowth from New Line to The Glen are in Charleville and said that it is an area which is being subjected to recent anti-social behavior, he asked if a gate could be installed and if a clean up of the area could take place.

Cllr JP O' Shea supported Cllr Doyles comments in this respect.

The Municipal District Officer agreed to meeting the group on Monday evening to explore the options available subject to funding.

Clir L Madden referred to the Village Enhancement Funding approved for Mourneabbey and asked if this project could proceed.

The Municipal District Officer responded Yes

Clir P Hayes welcomed the recent cleaning that took place at the Plaza in Mallow. He raised the issue of loose paving slabs at The Spa, Mallow.

The Municipal District Officer responded to say that this would be investigated.

Clir Gearoid Murphy welcomed the announcement of a public realm upgrade and welcomed the rollout of Dementia Awareness Training in Cork County Council.

4.2 Senior Executive Engineer's Report presented by Billy O' Sullivan SEE:

Members were presented with the Senior Executive Engineers report prior to the meeting. Members welcomed the report raised the following issues in relation to the report:

Clir L Madden raised the issue of signage on the N20 at Twopothouse and the fact that this is not visible to motorists at night, he asked if signage could be cleaned. He also asked if cats eyes on the road at Quartertown could be replaced and the fact that a public light had been knocked recently. He advised that a meeting has been requested by residents of Mourneabbey with TII to discuss issues being experienced on the N20.

Clir Gearoid Murphy referred to the new pedestrian crossing at St James Avenue, Mallow and the sharpness of the raised table, while he noted that painting of the crossing had taken place recently, he asked if this could be re-aligned for a softer approach.

Clir JP O' Shea said that there appears to be an issue with a lack of road lining contractors at present and while he said that recent bad weather is also having an effect, he said that lining is not taking place.

Clir P Hayes said that the Muddy Hill in Mallow is a safety issue for both drivers and pedestrians and he asked if a one-way system could be considered here. He also asked for an update on the proposed pedestrian crossing at the Spa leading to Tipp O' Neill Park.

Clir E Kenny raised the issue of regular maintenance that should take place in cemeteries across the district. He also asked if there had been any update with regard to contact with the Miscarriage Association on erecting a memorial.

Clir T O' Shea asked if there is a public lighting programme available for 2024.

Clir I Doyle paid compliments to work done by community groups during the recent Anti-Litter Campaign particularly in Charleville, Milford, Dromina and Newtown and he acknowledged to huge support of Cork County Council here also.

He also asked if there are any plans for traffic calming measures in Dromina, where is said that a ramp seems to be the only visible option.

Cllr JP O' Shea referred to NTA projects amounting to €2.9m and asked if any allocation has been made.

Response:

The Senior Executive Engineer responded as follows:

He will revert to Cllr Madden re issue at Quartertown, Mallow.

He agreed that a period of dry weather is required for road linin to take place.

He will follow up with regard to Cllr Hayes query on Muddy Hill, Mallow.

He will revert to members with a public lighting programme.

He confirmed to Cllr JP O' Shea that no allocation for NTA projects has been made to date.

The Municipal District Officer responded to say that engagement has taken place with the Mis-carriage Association.

5. ANY OTHER BUSINESS

Cllr P Hayes asked if it would be possible to improve the signage for the Tourist Office located at Spa House.

Cllr JP O' Shea asked if it would be possible to write to Cluid Housing Association with regard to wall at Cois Abhinn Estate in Freemount, Co Cork.

He referred to gullies which appear to have dropped on the road outside Modular Housing Project in Charleville and he asked if this could be investigated.

Our pool is open from 5.30am to 10pm, Monday to Friday, catering to the needs of both adults and children. We offer a variety of classes and facilities during these hours.


Weekend Hours
